Dear Parents, Carers and Community members,

Welcome to the 2021 school year. It is great to see so many returning students and we especially welcome all new students. It promises to be an actionpacked year with centenary celebrations as a backdrop throughout the year to teaching, learning, and boarding life.

It is great to report that despite an interrupted 2020, Year 12 graduates achieved impressive results. Of our 14 Year 12 students;

- 100% completed a recognised qualification
- 100% of QTAC applicants received an offer
- 13 students completed one or more VET qualifications
- 19 VET qualifications issued in total

Year 7 – 10 result and data was also very good. Highlights included;

- Consistent & steady growth Year 8-10 Reading
- Consistent & steady growth Year 7-10 Maths
- Sharp & consistent growth Year 7-10 Writing

We look forward to building on these successes in 2021.



Today we held our Commencement Mass and Induction of Student Leaders. This provided the first opportunity to acknowledge the legacy of the Sisters of Mercy and their dedication over the last 100 years to education here at Herberton. Originating in the heart and mind of the Parish Priest of the time, Fr. Patrick Bernard Doyle and enlivened by the Sisters of Mercy from its inception, Mount St Bernard College has evolved to meet the needs of the time.

As the foundress of the Sisters of Mercy, Catherine McAuley, did in Dublin nearly 100 years prior (1824), Fr Bernard and the local Sisters built a large 'House of Mercy'. Catherine stated that "no work of charity can be more productive of good to society than the careful instruction of women' and it was with this care and nurturing spirit that the Sisters of Herberton set about providing this 'instruction'.

Many, many Sisters of Mercy have followed the wonderful legacy of the vision and practice of the foundress Catherine McAuley. Catherine McAuley believed education is an essential ingredient in the betterment of both individuals and society. Catherine also inspired people to be living witnesses of God's mercy in the world and it continues today Education in the spirit of Mercy at Mount St Bernard College is embedded in our values. We encourage our students, and all community members to commit to these values, values of;

- Community the way of living and giving gracious hospitality in the spirit of family,
- Mercy acting justly with a compassionate heart,
- Respect through valuing self, others, environment and the purpose of school,
- Excellence by striving towards personal best, and
- Wisdom through gaining life enhancing knowledge and skills.

The ministry of the Sisters of Mercy from those early days at Mount St Bernard College, till when the last sisters ceased residing at the College in 2018, has evolved and adapted to the times. The Sisters of Mercy were always practical and a wonderful source of real expressions of the Gospel.







The lay staff of Mount St Bernard College are now charged with this legacy and must likewise evolve and adapt with the times. We must 'be mercy' in the world and particularly those we educate at the College so that we can continue to "empower young people through our commitment to education to become persons of faith, learning and hope, and so contribute to their communities" (College Mission Statement)

I acknowledge that MSB accepts no responsibility for the loss, theft, unauthorised use or damage of any of my personal belongings.



#### BOARDING HOUSE MOBILE PHONE POLICY AND CONTRACT

Mobile phones are convenient and provide an easy method of communication between boarders' and their family and friends. Mobile phones do have dangers associated with them and this contract aims to minimise risks and provide security for all users. All students who bring a mobile phone to the Boarding house are asked to sign a contract outlining the conditions associated with having a mobile in the boarding house. Any breaches to these conditions will result in the phone being confiscated.

Conditions of use:

- □ Only 1 mobile allowed per person
- Mobiles must not be used to harass or bully others
- □ Mobiles must not be used to take photos/video of others without their consent
- □ Mobiles must not be used in the dining room during dinner or during study
- I Mobiles must not be used to search/send inappropriate content
- Mobiles must be charged by the owner
- Mobiles will be collected each night at a designated time
- Mobiles are the responsibility of the owner
- L Any change to the number or phone needs to be told to the Head of Boarding
- □ All boarders must have the Head of Boarding's number in their contacts for safe travel purposes
- □ Chargers need to be tested for safety students to supply chargers

Any user that breaches these conditions will have their phone confiscated for a period specified by the Head of Boarding.

Members of selected Peninsula Teams / and or Peninsula individuals participate and compete in the Queensland (State) School Sport Championships. From these State Championships a Queensland Team / and or Queensland individuals will be selected to represent the State at Australian (National) School Sport Championships.

#### # Attend Australian (National) School Sport Championships.

Members of selected Queensland Teams / and or Queensland individuals participate and compete in the Australian (National) School Sport Championships.


